In the name of God, I Anne, I Margaret M. McDowell
of the County of Jackson State of Georgia being of sound
mind & disposing memory, being sensible that I will have to
die, have thought proper by this my last will & testament
do dispose of my worldly goods & effects, Inasmuch as my soul is
God who grant it & my body to be decently interred in the earth
from which it came

1st I give & bequeath unto my beloved son Allen M. McDowell
three negroes named Jordan Parker & John but should it
so happen that Jordan not be retained from my other son
his representatives, that he shall have hundred dollars in
lieu thereof out of the proceeds of other property that is to be
sold before a division is made of the money I also give
him a good bed & furniture

2nd I give & bequeath unto my beloved daughter Margaret
Melina M. McDowell three negroes named Harriet B. M. &
Aker, one good bed & furniture & all my blue Shirts

3rd I give & bequeath unto my beloved daughter Elizabeth
Caroline M. McDowell three negroes named Praise, Jem,
Pillariah, & one good bed & furniture which negroes
& their increase at her death to be equally divided
amongst her three living children

And the balance of my negroes namely Azee, Peggy
& Will, with all the rest of my property both real & personal
I wish & will to be sold in the way my executors may think
most advisable, to be sold by them and after all my just
costs is paid out of said proceeds & the debts due me I wish
to be equally divided between my two aforementioned
children Allen C. & Margaret M. M. McDowell
I do hereby nominate & appoint James Strong

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Allen L. McDowell & David Webb as Executors to this my last will &
testament given under my hand & seal this July 1894

Georgia I William Webb being much afflicted
Jackson County & conscious of my approaching end and
being sound in mind make this my last will & testament.
1st I give the sum of ten dollars to my wife Rachel after paying all my
just debts the land & household on which I now live one negro woman
named Kate, one named Sue, one named Dice, one small girl
Thompson, one little boy Sam, together with all the stock horses, hogs
& cattle, household & kitchen furniture during her lifetime
& at her death to be divided in manner herein after directed
But provided she should marry, she is to have the woman
Dice & one bed, one cow & half an acre of land the balance of the
property to be divided between my children by my present wife
with the exception of one hundred dollars, which to be equally
divided between my first children or their representatives to the
part out of the estate four years after my decease the balance
of my property after my wife's death in marriage is to be equal
divided between my present wife's children with the exception
of one daughter Susan which is to have two hundred dollars
more, than any one of the others. In testimony whereof I have
