Item 3^r I give & bequeath to my Daughter Harriet my Negro Boy
Tom to her her life time & at her death to my Grand
son Nathan L. Nash

Item 4^t I give & bequeath to my Daughter Mary a Negro Girl
named Sarah to her & her heirs & assigns for ever

Item 5^h I give & bequeath to my two Daughters Nancy & Harriet
my Negro Woman named Caroline & all her property &
I also further give to them all the other property I
have or am seized in Right of without specifying
or particularly naming what property I have a right
to to them & their heirs & assigns forever and I hereby
nominate and appoint my Son Nathan Nash as the
Executor to carry into Effect this my last will and
Testament In witness whereof I have hereunto set my
hand & seal this 5th day of December 1850
