perfect sound mind & memory & calling to mind the uncertainty of life
& the certainty of death do make this my last will & Testament
canceling & disannulling all former wills heretofore by me made
I now ^{do} dispose my body to the grave, & my soul unto the hands
of him whom I receive it in full confidence of their
reunion in the morning of the resurrection from the dead &
that to everlasting life

To my dearly beloved wife Sarah Bostain I give the greatest all my
real estate including the plantation whereon I now live
together with that of my son Jacob Bostain
now live all my stock of horses cattle & hogs household
& kitchen furniture during her natural life to withdraw
& at her decease or marriage to be divided among my
children in the following manner, to wit, To my daughter
Hannah Bostain I give & bequeath the sum of one hundred
thirty dollars over & above her equal division of all the
residue of my estate after the payment of my just debts
Item ^{do} To my sons Jacob Bostain & Matthew Bostain, to my
daughters Elizabeth Bostain, Roger Bostain Hannah
Bostain agreed, And Nelly G. Pitt, I give & bequeath
all the residue of my estate to be divided among them
& share alike

Item ^{do} I do hereby constitute & appoint my wife Sarah
Bostain, my son in law John Pitt, & Richard W.
Perkins the executors of this my last will & Testament
In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and
affixed my seal this 18th day of March 1823

Georgia ³ The following is the true last will and
testament of Michael M. Howell ~~deceased~~
who died on the third day of September Eighteen hundred
& twenty three in Stokes County State of North Carolina
as made expressed & published by him in his last illness
the day before he died though not reduced to writing
before his death, the said Michael M. Howell did give
the貫ath unto his wife all of his property to do with &
dispose of as she pleased, except a tract of land which he
had previously conveyed to his son Allen by Deed of
Gift & willed he desired that she should have the sole
management thereof thereby appointing her sole executrix
The bond he made use of before in substance as follows
on the evening before he died being asked if he had any
thing to say about the disposal of his property answered &
said yes I want Peggy to have it, he was then asked if he
wished Mr. M. Howell to have it all, answered yes I wish
her to have it all & the disposal of it all except a tract
of land ~~which~~ for which I have made a deed of gift to Allen
M. Howell Nov. 21st 1823
