 received by him without being subject to the payment of any part
 of my debts. All the rest & residue of my estate both real and
 personal consisting of lands, bonds, in other free account, money
 rights & credits of the household & kitchen furniture of stock of
 various kinds, be they of what nature or kind soever, I give and
 bequeath unto my beloved wife Polly Williamson after my debts are
 paid, which are to be satisfied out of my real & personal estate
 so as aforesaid devised to her, & out of no other part. And I do
 nominate constitute & appoint my said beloved wife Polly Will-
 iamson my sole executrix of this my last will & testament
 hereby revoking & making void all my other wills & wills
 at any time past or present made by me made to declare the
 to be my last will & testament, Testifying whereof I have the
 whole containing one half sheet of paper, subscribed my name
 & affixed my seal the day of September in the year 1800
 before death & die.

Justus deceased portion of James Johnson Justus, Patsey Gillum
Justus & their issue to the sum of one hundred dollars each
to be raised from estate
- 10^d I give to my son in law Dan on Combs one dollar
- 11^d the residue of my estate not herein specially willed away to the
land & other property is to be by my executors hereafter to be
appointed to be disposed off in the best possible manner
as may think proper after paying of my debts & the money
specificaly willed away & incidental expenses paid to be divided
in two equal parts, the one part or half to be given to my son
Harry Justus & the other part or half to Negiah McCulchen
