 will & testament in manner & form following, I give bequeath
 unto my brother William Williamson the following negroes, to wit;
 a negro woman by the name of Mourner the four children
 by the names of Sally, Gabriel, Harriet & Rachael a negro woman
 by the name of Coby, their child together with any future increase that
 the said two negro women may have also a negro fellow by the name
 of Isham, a negro boy by the name of Peter, the said negroes to be
 received by him without being subject to the payment of any part
 of my debts. All the rest residue of my estate both real and
 personal consisting of lands, bonds, notes, free accounts, money
 rights & credits of household & kitchen furniture of stock of
 various kinds be they of what nature or kind soever, I give and
 bequeath unto my beloved wife Polly Williamson after my debts are
 paid, which are to be satisfied out of my real & personal estate
 so as aforesaid devised to her, & out of the other part, and I do
 nominate constitute & appoint my said beloved wife Polly Will-
 iamson my sole executrix of this my last will & testament
 hereby making & making void all & every other will & wills
 at any time heretofore made by me made & do declare this
 to be my last will & testament, In witness whereof I have (the
 whole containing one half sheet of paper) subscribed my name
 & affixed my seal the day of September in the year 1800
 signed sealed & delivered.

- 7th I give to my daughter Patsy McCutchen my negro woman called
Amy & her boy child called Isaac
- 8th I give to my daughter Dalley Blacklock my negro woman called
Lolli Lid & my negro girl Patsy
- 9th I give to my grand child on the heir of my son William
Luster deceased to wit / James Johnson Luster, Patsy Gilliam
Luster & this sum I set as the sum of one hundred dollars each
to be raised from estate
- 10th I give to my son in law Sam on Combs one dollar
- 11th The residue of my estate not herein specially willed away by the
Land & other property, is to be by my executor hereafter to be
appointed to be disposed of in the best possible manner
He may think proper & after paying my debts & the money
specially willed away & incidental expenses paid to be divided
in two equal parts, the one part or half to be given to my son
Henry Luster & the other part or half ^{my daughter} to Reziak McCutchen
- Lastly I do hereby nominate constitute & appoint Henry
Luster executor to this my last will & testament
