 & ordain this my last will & testament, & first of all, I desire to give, & bequeath
 to almighty God, who gave it to me & my body to the earth from whence
 it came to be buried, in a decent christian manner & with regard to the
 worldly estate which it has pleased God to bless me with, It is my
 wish & desire to distribute it in the following manner, I give &
 bequeath unto my beloved Lucy Walling the whole & every part of my
 effects consisting of one school horse, one copper still, & two notes of
 hand on one Samuel Prewitt for fifty dollars due the first day of
 this month, & one on Middleton Brooks for twenty five Dollars due
 the twenty fifth of December next & my crop of corn. On considera-
 tion, ^{that} ~~should~~ my & dear wife's heirs should at any time after my decease
 make application to the said Lucy Walling, or to my exe-
 cutors hereafter named that they pay to them each of them the sum
 of one dollar those heirs are my four children, Mrs. Pricilla, Thomas,
 Packard & Hannah Walling but if neither of them should reason-
 ably, either personally or by attorneys for their part of the estate
 it is my wish & desire that my beloved Lucy should keep & possess the
 the whole of it. And I do hereby constitute & appoint my beloved
 wife Lucy Walling & my trusty friend & step son John W. Enck
 my sole executor to cause this my last will & testament in to
 execution in witness where of I have hereunto set my hand and
 seal this 22^d day of October in the year of our Lord 1825
