 County of Jackson State of Georgia do make this my last  
 will & testament in manner & form following, I give my  
 soul to almighty God; hoping for pardon for all my  
 sins, through the sufferings of my Lord, & saviour Jesus  
 Christ. For my worldly estate which it hath pleased  
 God, to bestow on me, I do give in manner & form  
 following, I give to my son Nathan McGehee five shillings  
 Sterling with all that he has recd. of me, to him & his  
 for ever. I give to my son Gepe McGehee one negro  
 named Simon & eighty pounds to be paid in dollars at the  
 shillings each to him & his heirs forever. I give to my  
 daughter Patsy McGehee a negro Peg & a pair of  
 and a black horse named Gault & eighty pounds

to be paid in dollars at six shillings each during his life  
 at his death to be equally divided between my four sons  
 Robert, Osborn & Solomon to them and their heirs for ever  
 I give to my son Nathaniel Meghe a negro man named  
 Tom feathers & furniture. & eighty pounds to be paid  
 dollars at six shillings each to him & his heirs for ever  
 I give to my son Osborn Meghe one Negro boy named  
 Pete & eighty pounds to be paid in dollars at six shillings  
 each to him & his heirs for ever. I give to my son Solomon  
 Meghe a negro boy named Mam Chested & eighty  
 pounds to be paid in dollars at six shillings each  
 to him & his heirs for ever. I give to my son Michael  
 five shillings sterling to him and his heirs for ever  
 I give all the rest of my estate be it of what  
 or quality so ever to be divided between my sons  
 Osborn & Solomon equally. I do appoint my son  
 Meghe & my friend John Shapard to be the executors  
 of this my last Will & Testament in which things I have  
 set my hand & seal this 15<sup>th</sup> day of August 1803  
 sealed & delivered in the presence of Nathan<sup>li</sup> Meghe  
 of John Shapard
