Do ordain this My Last Will & Testament as following

1<sup>st</sup> It is My Will that all my just Ditties be Paid out of such portion  
of My Property as My Wife and Executors may think proper  
to be sold at publick or Private Sale as they may Deem My  
Wife Jane Sharp having full Power to order & Direct matters  
at her Will

2<sup>nd</sup> It is My Will that the Balance of My Estate be left the entire  
Control & Management of My Wife Jane Sharp During her  
Widowhood With this Exception My Sons William J Sharp and  
Edmond J Sharp Each having had a horse I Give My son Noah C  
Sharp fortyfive Dollars in place of a horse & My son Carleton  
Sharp & Rufus H Sharp have Each one year schooling and My  
son Jarril J Sharp have one year & six Months schooling or  
two years as opportunity may Serve Each of the three last named  
Sons to have a horse worth forty Dollars if they get it at or near  
the age of twenty one year and Each of My Daughters Mary &

Sharp & Marilla P. Sharp have a horse worth forty Dollars  
& if either of the above named Children fail to get a horse they  
are to have forty Dollars in Money or other Property to that Value  
and if my wife Jane Sharp should not survive till all the Children  
come to the age of twentyone years My Brother Lewis J. Sharp  
is to have the Management of My Minor Children after  
which time there shall be an Equal Division of the balance  
of My Estate between all My Children by Sale or Lot as  
they may agree

I hereby revoke all other Wills & Testaments heretofore made by  
me & appoint My Brother Lewis J. Sharp My Executor to  
see the whole of this My Last Will & Testament executed  
he should die & if he die before it be wound up any two of my  
sons that the Court may appoint shall take the unfinished  
Part into their hands & wind it up In witness whereof I  
have this Day set my hand & seal this 23 Day of June 1847
