Revoking & disannulling all other wills heretofore made
by me I give with my soul to almighty God, who first
gave it & my body to the earth from whence it came to be
buried at the distribution of my executor (all my worldly
goods which it has pleased God to bless me with
I do give & dispose of in the manner following, viz)
Item 1st It is my will that all my just debts should be
paid out of such of my estate as can be the best spent
and the balance of my estate both real & personal

to be kept together until the twelve years from the date hereof the
for which he is equally indebted to each of the said parties between my late
Wife's death, that I may see before the children, viz. Elizabeth, William
William, Elizabeth, Jeremiah, Jackson, & Louisa, by date or
otherwise as may best conduce to their common interest under
the supervision of my executors.

Item 2^d If my ^{Wife} ~~Wife~~ & I should constitute & appoint my beloved
Sally Lord James Silman & Deane Silman my sole
executors to this my last will & testament. In witness whereof
I do hereunto set my hand & affix my seal the 5th day of March
1809.
