Jackson County: I Obidime, Ryan of the State and County aforesaid being in a Low State of health but sound and perfect in Mind and Memory and knowing that it is appointed to all once to die do make this my Last Will and Testament to wit

1st In obedience to the Last Will and Testament of my late Husband Phillip Ryan I do I Request that my negroes will remain on the plantation upon which I now live during Their living under the superintendence of John Dancy & Archabald Moore and for the net proceeds of their Labour to be applied to the use of my Daughter Elizabeth Hall and in case of her death to the use of my son Whitehead Ryan I further wish that if ^{my} son Whitehead Ryan Expires it be shall be supported by the Labour of said negroes and then the Proceeds to be applied as above Directed

2nd for the use of the said negroes I give all my Plantation Tools one Sower Man my Interest in a Cart & Oxen belonging to Phillip Ryan and myself together with a flax wheel and loom. My present Stock of Hogs & two Milch cows

3rd I give to Sarah Dyer thirtyfive Dollars being a balance of fifty Dollars left her by the Will of her Grand father

4th To my Grandson Whistley Name I give twenty Dollars

5th To my Grand Daughter Susan Sampson I give ^{all} my household furniture and my bed also such part or parts of land as may be drawn by me in the contemplated land belonging to her & her heirs also one Cow & calf

6th To my Grandson Lewis Sampson a horse & saddle and a good Suit of Cloaths to be given him on his becoming Eighteen years of age

7th I Request that one bed may be left in the House where I now

Reside for the use of my son William Ryan
I request that a certain tract of Land known by the
and lying in 20th Dist Part of County be sold by William
Ryan and the proceeds to be equally divided between him
and his sister Elizabeth Hall

9th I request that all my horses & cattle which are not otherwise
disposed of be sold & the money applied to the payment
of debts & to the use of my daughter Elizabeth Hall

10th I desire that the tract of Land upon which I now dwell
after the death of my negroes be divided between John
and Archabald Mason

11th I hereby appoint John Mason and Archabald Mason
-ing of this my Last Will and Testament - I writing this
