 & testament, To my dearly beloved wife Nancy Bowen I give my
 two negro women, Doll & Bess during her life to help
 support her in her old age these said women with 4000 \$ & 10
 whatever income may proceed from them hereafter to be
 equally divided between my son Thomas, My son Perry
 & daughter Virginia David, fifty dollars to be paid out of
 the value of said negroes to my son Heratio Bowen after the
 decease of his mother Perry Bowen to be paid a reasonable price
 for the support of said increase till he is of age & I have desire
 with these other negroes & designate in writing his portion of land
 there may be so much said on that some all household & fix-
 tures & plantation tools & stock of some description
 to my son Perry to balance what I have given the others
 except the milk horse or what I may buy for him & design
 to make up lack in Hiram's land
 I constitute & appoint my friend & Brother John H. Jones
 my executor of this my last will & testament When I
 have hereunto set my hand & seal this 4th of Sept 1825
