In the name of God Amen, I Peter Boyer of the state of Georgia and
county of Jackson taking into consideration my mortal state think it proper & fit
in good health reason understanding to dispose of such worldly property
as I am possessed of therefore I do hereby publish the following as my last
Will & testament in manner & form following (viz) I first desire my
body to be buried in such a place as my executors may think proper
secondly I do hereby give to my wife Hannah during her natural
life subject however to the following restrictions & conditions the
tract of land & house wherein I now live that is to say all the tract
originally occupied by Thomas Townsend to hold the premises during
her life provided that she lives & resides on the same but she shall not
sell rent nor lease the same to any person or persons whatsoever
unless by the consent & approbation of my son Robert neither
shall she admit any kind of family to settle thereon without the
consent of him the said Robert who is hereby authorized to interfere
so far as needful for the good management of said premises I do hereby
give to my wife the following Negro viz Jane, Flora & Dinah

Six cows & calves twenty hogs & two work horses the cattle they she
 may choose herself but the horses to be averaged a good able to
 the quality of stock generally also one waggon together with
 such part of the household furniture & farming utensils as
 my executors may think necessary for her to retain & also
 whatever stock of provisions may be on hand at my decease
 shall be considered for the use of the family It is also my
 Will & desire that immediately after the death of my said
 wife then my executors shall take possession of the property hereby
 devised to her & apply the same as is hereafter directed all the horses
 cattle, hogs, household furniture & farming utensils to be into
 & the money arising therefrom to be equally divided amongst such
 of my children as may then be living & the land & waggon to be
 disposed of as hereafter directed, I give & bequeath to my daughter
 Catherine one negro wench named Penny the younger girl
 & her child Betty, & hereby confirm to her all & every thing she
 ever received of me, I give & bequeath to my son John all
 the stone goods money Debts land, & the waggon which
 may belong to said firm & one third part of my land
 in Hancock County on the waters of Shoulders
 creek & also all my books & maps, book case & desk, I give &
 bequeath to my son Robert all that tract of land originally
 occupied by Thomas Townsend where Snow live that is to say
 after the death of my said wife, the said Robert shall take
 possession of the said tract of land & the said Robert do have
 Saml. Flora, & Dianah after the death of my wife I also give
 Belle, Lewis & Jack & two stills & all the stilling vessels & one
 barrel horn to the said Robert, I give & bequeath to my son
 Peter all the two tracts of land ^{now} owned by me originally
 occupied by Henry Townsend & William Malone & one notation
 man named Sam, & one negro boy named Jacob & one
 thousand dollars cash to be paid to him by my son John
 immediately after my death, I do hereby give & bequeath to
 my daughter Rebecca one third part of my land sit on
 on the waters of Shoulders Hancock County & one
 negro wench named Susannah, Also one negro girl
 named Peggy & one feather bed & furniture one gillie

I do hereby give the quoth to my youngest daughter Ann one third part of my land on the waters of Abutaba some called Hancock county and also three slaves Perry the elder her two children Charity & Enoch I do hereby give & bequeath to my grandson Bisho Clement our negro boy named Haver.

With respect to my other property such as debts that it be considered as a fund to answer my lawful demands that may happen & the balance that may remain be equally divided among my children now living I do hereby appoint Montgomery Edwards Adams & son John my sole executor of this my last will & testament, In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this twenty first day of February in the year of our Lord 1814 signed sealed & published in the presence of us
