- 1st I give unto my wife Obedience all my estate real & personal during her natural life with power to give away any part thereof to such of my children or grand children as she may find stands in need of the same
- 2^d After the death of my wife I desire that my negro shall remain on my land & have the privilege of having their time to be under the control of William Matthew & Thomas Mitchell two of my executors herein after named the hire to be distributed among such of my grand children as my said by will may direct
- 3^d I desire that my wife shall give unto my two grand daughters Savannah Lumpkin & Sarah Nance fifty dollars each if she can conveniently spare the same but if she cannot then my surviving executor after the death of my wife to see this part of my will is complied with
- 4th I desire there shall be no division or sale of my estate to be managed by my wife & other executors in such manner as they may deem most proper by appointing my wife Obedience my sole trustee
