

In the name of God Amen I Proffer Horton of the State of Georgia & County of Jackson in perfect health & perfect mind & memory thanks be given unto God, calling into mind the mortality of my body & knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die, do make & ordain this my last will & testament, that is to say, principally first of all I give & recommend my soul into the hands of almighty God that gave it. My body I recommend to the earth to be buried in a decent Christian burial at the discretion of my executors nothing doubting but at the general resurrection, I shall receive the same again by the mighty power of God, & as touching such worldly estate where with it has pleased God, to bless me in this life I give devise & dispose of the same in the following manner I first give & bequeath unto Sarah Horton my daughter all that part of the land that Snow live on that lies on the south west side of Walnut fork of Oconee river containing two hundred thirty acres, more or less and one horse bridle & saddle, one cow & calf, one feather bed & furniture to be left to her own choice

secondly, I give & bequeath unto my beloved wife Sarah Horton one third part of the profits arising from the plantation wherein Snow live lying on the north side of Walnut fork of the Oconee, during her widowhood & the other two thirds to be equally divided between my sons Fletcher & Proffer Horton during such widowhood & after the death or marriage of my wife Sarah I do give & bequeath the above described plantation & premises & all the land attached thereto to my sons Fletcher & Proffer Horton and all the rest of property after all my just debts are paid, and two hundred dollars to William Clement to be equally divided among my legates except Sarah Clement & her part of my property except what she already had is to be equally divided among the issue of her body & the two illegitimate children that is said to my son William Horton that is to say James T. Fleming & William M. Fleming provided Washington Allen

my son in law does give a full satisfactory account & return of all the
 money & property my then Willam had at the time of his death in his posses-
 ion without any trouble or expense he is to be considered as one of my heirs
 in the general provisions of this my will, & if not he is to be excluded
 from any further part of my property except what he has already had
 & my property to be equally divided amongst the rest of my heirs ^{except as before} ~~except~~
 And I do hereby constitute & ordain James Hemphill & William
 Bell esqrs. my executors to this my last will & testament And I do hereby
 utterly disallow & disannul all & every other former testament, will
 bequest, bequests & executors by me in any line before named willed and
 bequeathed & ratifying & confirming this & no other to be my last will and

4th I stand to my loving wife Ruth Neel one third part of all
my land during her natural life

5th My will & desire is that my daughter Peggy W. Neel
may have the use of the other two thirds of my lands to
support & to school her

6th After the decease of my wife Ruth Neel I give to my
daughter Peggy W. Neel all my land to her then heirs
forever. And lastly I do hereby constitute & appoint my
friends Joseph Weber, & my wife Ruth Neel executor
& executrix in this my last will & testament
