 I Robert Beavers being very weak & low in
 body, but of sound mind & memory & taking into consideration
 the uncertainty of life & the certainty of death & wishing to settle
 my worldly affairs do make & ordain this my last will and
 testament in manner & form following to wit:
 First It is my desire that all my just debts shall be paid out
 of my estate

Secondly I will that my wife Jane Beavers have fifty acres
 of my land jointly with Alexander's land including the
 cabins & plantation on the south side of Buffalo Creek
 to dispose of as she pleases also my boy man one feather
 & furniture & all the Beavers & Snow property also two cows
 & the land on the river & the mill & the bridge

Saddle all the above to be disposed of in any manner my son wife shall please

Thirdly To my eldest daughter Esther Hunt I bequeath thirty dollars
To my son Joseph Beavers I bequeath fifty dollars To my daughter
Richard Brooks I bequeath thirty dollars To my daughter Polly
Heemans I bequeath thirty dollars To the rest of my children to wit
Newben Palsey Elizabeth Salter Charity John & Silas I bequeath
the residue of my estate both real & personal to be equally
divided among them. It is my will that my four single daugh-
ters to wit, Palsey Sally Botsey & Charity have the feather beds &
furniture as they now severally claim which is to be apart of
their legacies in my estate I further bequeath to my daughters
Botsey & Charity fifteen dollars each of the money I am to get
for keeping Sarah Watson for the trouble they have taken
with her, I then I hereby also constitute & appoint my son
Newben Beavers executor to this my last will & testament
husby revoking all former wills what ever I witness thereof
I hereunto set my hand seal this 12th day of January 1808
