I Robert M. Holladay of the State of Georgia and County of Jackson being in Public Health but of Sound Mind & Memory Do Make & Publish this My Last Will & Testament in Manner & form as follows I appoint Beatrix M. Holladay My sole Executrix to this My Will

first It is My Will & Desire that My Wife Martha Dargling Holladay have & Enjoy a support During her Natural life from the plantation known as New River

Secondly I Give & bequeath in Common to Beatrix M. Holladay and to Walter H. Holladay so much of that Part of the tract of land on which I now reside lying upon Common Martins Creek the portion line and the Hall tract as shall include seventy acres of said tract of land & also all My Personal effects of all sorts & kinds

Thirdly I Give & bequeath to My Daughter Beatrix M. Holladay & Julia C. Holladay all My Stock of Cattle & horses & Hogs & flock of Geese & Poultry to be all kept together on the Place where I now reside it being My Desire that it shall serve to the support of all the Family now with me I also give them all my household and Kitchen furniture but to remain for the maintenance of all my Family now with me during the term of the life of my Wife. It is further My Will that after the Death of my Wife all the land I own not bequeathed to my sons Beatrix and Walter shall then vest in my two Daughters Beatrix M. & Julia C. Holladay
