Georgia — I, Robert Venable, being in a low state of health Jackson County, believe it to be my duty, to close my temporal Concerns — I therefore Ordain and appoint James M. Cunningham and Isabella Venable, my wife, my lawful Executors —

I give and bequeath to, my beloved wife all of the plantation whereon we now live, together with all the stock and Farming Utensils thereon, with one bed & furniture, together with my very Horse Tom, & bay filly Hann, together with my other Horse whereon Henry Mann now lives — Also my Negro woman Rachel and her son Andy — all of which she is to have the use of during her widow-hood, this for the special use of herself & family — I further will that at the end of the year eighteen hundred and thirty two, my Negro Mann, Bob, my Negro woman Polly and her two Children Bin & Mabel, together with my lot of Land lying near Saintsville in Hall County, all be sold at public outcry, or at the best private Sale, my aforesaid Executors can procure — and that the money accruing, from said Sale, be lent at interest, if it can so be done in good hands, until my Children become of age, and at they do arrive of age that a Negro be purchased, such a one as can be bought with their portion of the money — and that their portion to be given to them — The rest of my beget to be at my wife's disposal to be distributed amongst the children when she may think proper.

I further will that all of my debts be collected, and the old portions of my property herein not mentioned

be appropriated to the payment of my debts, and the
use and support of the Family—

Negroes namely, Hane, a negro woman, a negro boy
Griggs, and in case she the said Susannah should
die, then my aforesaid property or Estate to be given
up to my Daughter Pernelia with the exception of my
aforesaid Slave Negro Woman Hane, and the
