 Sam^l Sarah Brown, Jonathan Haggard, George Haggard
 Francis Hardy, Hannah Cook, Susannah Haggard,
 I do also give & bequeath unto my two youngest sons Merck
 Haggard & Alfred Haggard at my wife's death all my estate
 both real & personal to be equally divided between them
 the land also to be equally divided between them when
 I now live to be divided due East & West, & Merck to have
 the north end & Alfred the south end each to our part to
 contain by estimation one hundred acres, And I do
 hereby appoint Jesse Bennett, & Thomas Perry sole
 executors of this my last will & testament hereby revoking
 all former Wills by me made
 In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal
 this 20th day of August in the year of our Lord 1810
 signed sealed & delivered by the above named Samuel
 Haggard to be his last will & testament in the presence
 of us who at his request & at his request have hereunto
 subscribed our names as witnesses to the same

 April in the year of our Lord 1810, I the said Samuel Haggard
 of the County of Jackson Georgia formerly being very sick & weak
 in body but of perfect mind & memory that is to say I give & bequeath
 for the same & calling to mind the mortality of my body and
 knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die do
 make & ordain this my last will & testament that is to say prin-
 cipally & first of all I give & commend my soul into the
 hands of God who gave it - & for my body I commend it to
 the earth to be buried in a decent & Christian like
 manner at the discretion of my executors nothing doubting
 but at the general resurrection I shall receive the
 same by the mighty power of God, & touching such worldly
 estate wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me in this
 life I give devise & dispose of the same in manner and
 form following, viz: In the first place I give & bequeath
 to Mark Snow one negro woman & her child
