 Mary a girl, and all my household & kitchen furniture
 I give to my sister Charity Winters & Margaret Tinson
 when they arrive to age the same having been told
 by my executors herein named given under my hand & seal
 the 27th January 1829

fifteen dollars. I wish to be given up to him in the event of
my death

I now all men by these knowe that I Charles Dammou being
of sane mind, do appoint my son Uriah Dammou my executor of
this my last will & testament

1st I give & bequeath unto my beloved wife Polly Dammou all my personal
all, property, except one cow & half hereafter to be disposed of during her
natural life & after her decease to be equally divided between
my son Uriah Dammou & my daughter Peggy & Nancy and
the children of my daughter Polly Audlin & also my plantation
whereon I now live during her life together with its appurtenances
I then give the same to my wife Polly a note which I hold
on Asa Varnum

2nd I give & bequeath to my son Uriah the plantation tract
of land whereon I now live after the decease of his mother

3rd I give & bequeath to my daughter Nancy Dammou my tract
of land known as the Edwards tract

4th I give & bequeath to my daughter Peggy Dammou one half of the
tract of land whereon Peter Audlin now lives

5th I give ^{and my son Joseph & daughter} the other half of my tract whereon Peter Audlin
now lives in trust for the sole use & benefit of my daughter
Polly Audlin & after her death to her children

6th I give & bequeath unto my son in law Peter Anglin one cow & half
now in his possession

7th And it is my desire that my executor shall sell all the lands
which I have drawn up the late land lottery of Georgia
whereon it can be done to the best advantage for the
purpose of paying my debts & the support of my family
