Georgia In the name of God Amen, I Samuel
 Jackson County Poor of the State Hospital for incurables affected
 weak of body, but of sound mind & memory thank to God for his
 mercy towards me, also knowing that it is a privy unto all
 men once to die — I have thought proper to make this my
 last will & testament & first of all I commit my soul into
 the hands of the living God who gave it to me, my body to the
 earth to be buried in a decent Christian manner, And with
 regard to the worldly effects which it has pleased God to bless
 me with, it is my desire & will that it should be divided
 distributed in the following manner, this,
 I give & bequeath unto my beloved daughter Eliza & others each
 to them a feather bed & furniture which they have long pur-
 claimed as their, And secondly, I give & bequeath unto my
 beloved son Seymour, However, a feather bed & furniture ^{partly}
 shall be raised by executors hereafter named out of my estate
 to be applied by my executors in Satisfying the Son Seymour
 It is my desire that my executors hereafter named to appoint
 shall dispose of all the remainder of my worldly effects to the
 best advantage & with the least expense to my estate after, my
 household furniture, tools, & stock of all kinds the three
 tracts of land which I own viz., the one I now reside on in the
 county, one in the county of Early, home in the County of Lee
 & of this state — And that he should out of the proceeds thereof
 as soon as possible discharge all my just debts & funeral expenses
 to remunerate himself for the expenses of clearing the lots of
 land in the counties of Early & Lee for his trouble & expences for
 carrying this my will into execution. Fourthly, It is my will that
 the balance which may remain after carrying into execution

my foregoing will shall be equally divided among all my children (viz.)
 John Wiley, Samuel, George Seymour Spencer, Larissa, Barbara, Alice
 & Peter except that as I have heretofore given my beloved son Wiley above
 which I value at Thirty Dollars it is my will that that amount, shall be
 deducted out of his & divided among the rest of my aforesaid children
 3rd So there are some debts due me it is my will that when my executors
 shall collect the same - No 1 the amount be equally divided among all
 my aforesaid children, Sixthly, I do hereby appoint to name my
 beloved son John Post of Walton County State aforesaid my true
 trusted executor giving & granting him full power to carry into
 execution all & the further my wishes expressed in this will, And I do
 constitute & declare this to be my last will & testament & do hereby
 renounce all former wills, written or verbal constituting & calling this
 to be at me my last will & testament In witness whereof I have hereunto
 set my hand & affixed my seal this, tenth day of October in the year of
 our Lord one thousand eight hundred & Twenty nine
 signed & sealed the day and year above written in the presence of us
