 of whatever may then exist as well as land or
 stock to be sold & equally divided among
 my children And it is also my will
 and desire that my Girls & or if Polly
 here should remain as member of the
 family during the life of my said wife
 or until they Marry and it is my desire
 that that my wife should give one of the Child-
 ren ~~whom~~ she according to the Circumstances
 can spare on this leaving of the family
 Prop^d I Give & bequeath to my Son William
 my Young man Colt & Trappings Saddle &
 bridle Prop^d I Give & bequeath to my Son
 Sandford my Young Horse Colt & Fox and
 Nether to buy him a tolerable good Saddle &
 bridle - And I do hereby constitute & appoint
 my beloved wife Polly the whole Sole
 Executor of this my last will and testament
