 Samuel Wilson of the State & County aforesaid considering
 the uncertainty of this mortal life & being of sound mind
 & memory blessed be almighty God for the same do make
 & publish this my last will & testament in manner & form
 following that is to say first I give & bequeath unto my single
 daughters to wit, Mary, Liley, Lydia, Jane, & Harriette on
 their marriage or on their arrival to the age of twenty one
 years each & every one of my ^{now} ~~said~~ unmarried daughters one
 negro to be pointed out & delivered by my after named executor
 & executor which negro when delivered to each of my above named
 daughters is to be valued by three free hold of said County
 nominated by the Court of Ordinance of said County & the juror
 appointed to value said negro will say upon oath what the
 difference of price & value is between the negro pointed
 out & delivered as aforesaid by my executor & executor
 a negro girl of ^{the age of} eighteen years of good quality & if the appraisers
 are of opinion that the negro so pointed out is of less value
 than a negro girl of the age of eighteen years of good quality
 my executor & executor shall pay the difference in money
 to each of my above named daughters at the time of delivery
 of the negro & if the said appraisers are of opinion that the
 negro delivered as aforesaid is of more value than a negro
 girl of the age of eighteen years of good quality then
 each of my above named daughters shall pay the said
 difference in money to my executor & executor
 I do also give & bequeath unto my daughters Mary
 Liley, Lydia, Jane & Harriette each of them & her

a mane saddle bridle of the value of one hundred dollars & each
 a good feathered furniture & each two coats & calens to be delivered to
 them on their arrival to the age of twenty one years or on their marriage
 I also give & bequeath unto my sons Samuel, William, & John each
 of them a negro to be provided out & delivered them on each of their
 arrival to the age of twenty one years by my executrix & executor
 to be valued by the said appraiser, & if the said appraiser are of opinion
 that the negro provided out is of less value than a negro boy of the age of twenty
 one years of good quality then my executrix & executor is to pay the
 difference at the delivery of the negro in money & also I give & bequeath
 unto my said sons Samuel William & John each of them a horse
 or mane of the value of one hundred dollars saddle & bridle bed &
 furniture & two coats & calens on their arrival to the age of twenty
 one years to be delivered by my executrix & executor I do also will
 & order that my beloved wife Lucy Wilson do live in my house
 & have the care use & management of my property said pl
 antation (other than the property I have already ordered to
 give to my children on their marriage or coming of
 age) that my wife Lucy shall have the care raising & ~~and~~
 maintaining education & keeping in decent & respectable
 apparel all my children before named & defray the exp
 ences thereof by the profits of the plantation & the gross and
 if the proceeds of the crops shall more than supply my
 family with necessaries I will order that my wife shall
 purchase such property as will most benefit her & my
 children I further will & ~~order~~ ^{order} that my wife Lucy shall
 have the care & management of my plantation & property
 (not before disposed of) until my youngest son ^{becomes}
 of age unless my wife Lucy shall marry in which
 case I will order that her care & management of my
 plantation & other property shall cease & that my after
 named executor shall then & in that case have the sole
 & exclusive care & management thereof I do also will and
 ordain that my after named executor in case of the death
 or marriage of my wife Lucy shall then rent out my plantation
 & then out my negroes & all my other property & have the proceeds
 thereof on interest & have my children boarded at

respectable boarding houses, In case my wife Lucy survives
 before my son John becomes of age I give & bequeath
 unto him one negro to be equal in value to a negro girl
 of the age of eighteen years of good quality neither be
 more of the value of one hundred dollars one bed & furniture
 two cows & calves. If my wife Lucy remain unmarried when
 my youngest son John ^{arrives} ~~becomes~~ of the age of twenty
 I will give & bequeath unto him the one thousand dollars
 worth of my property to be chosen by ~~her~~ ^{me} & valued by ^{the} said
 appraisers. It is also my desire I will that all my land
 except the tract whereon my plantation lies shall be
 sold, if my executor & executor thinks proper & the
 money arising therefrom vested in such other property
 as will most benefit my wife & children when my
 youngest son John becomes ^{fully} of age years old or in
 case of his death as soon as the next youngest of my
 children that shall then be living shall arrive to three
 & twenty one years. I will order that all my lands to be
 sold in such manner as my executor & executor shall
 think proper and I also that will I order as soon as my
 said daughters Mary, Lucy, Lydia, Jane & Caroline or
 their children, & my said son Samuel William and
 John or their children & my wife Lucy shall receive the
 property, I have before given & bequeathed unto them that three
 or more fit & proper persons shall be nominated by the court of
 ordinary of said county to make a division of the remainder of
 my property in the following manner I give & bequeath
 the balance of my property of every description (except
 such property as I have given & bequeathed) unto my wife
 Lucy, my daughter Calhoun Allister, my daughter Sarah
 Leah my son Benjamin, my daughter Mary, my daughter
 Lucy, my daughter Lydia, my daughter Jane, my son Samuel
 my son William, my daughter Caroline, & my son John or to
 their children, to be equally divided between them.
 I do hereby appoint nominate & constitute my wife Lucy
 Wilson executrix, & my son Benjamin executor of
 this my last will & testament hereby revoking all

former will, & testaments made by me. In testimony whereof I have hereunto
set my hand & seal this 20th day of November eight hundred & eighteen
