

In the name of God I man Shadrack Deen of the state of Georgia County of Jackson being ^{now} afflicted in body tho' of perfect mind & memory thank be to God, calling unto mind it is appointed for all men once to die, do make & ordain this my last will & testament that is to say, in the first place I give & recommend my soul into the hand of God ~~who~~ ^{that} gave it & my I recommend to the will to be buried in a decent & Christian manner at the discretion of my executor & touching such of my worldly estate wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me with in this life I give devise & dispose of in the following manner to wit

First I give & bequeath to My dear wife three hundred & ninety six Acres of land in Colbert & Franklin County granted to William Alvo two feather beds & furniture & all my household furniture & one bay horse & grey mare all my cattle & hogs except two cows & calves during her natural life & my children that is now under age have the privilege of continuing with her as they now do free of expence, Secondly I give to Arche my son one grey mare bridle & saddle & one cow & calf & one hundred Acres of land where I now live granted to Robert Montgomery, The land bequeathed to my wife at her decease is to revert to Thomas, Jacob, Shadrack, John & Frederick But the other property bequeathed to her, to be at her disposal, & to my daughter Pufforance I give one cow & calf one feather bed & furniture, It is also my will that all my Just debts be paid out of the property I have willed & given to my wife, I do hereby constitute make & appoint my son Shadrack Deen executor of this my last will & testament confirming this & this only to be his last will & testament in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this fifteenth day of May 1811 signed & sealed in presence of

 First I give to beloved wife Susanna Scott one negro woman
 named Nanie & her girl child named Rachael
 together with their future increase to be disposed in any
 way she may think proper also two cows & calves, her own
 choice one bay horse called Plauter all my stock of hogs
 one feather bed & furniture all my household & kitchen furni-
 ture & all my plantation tools all to be at her disposal
 except our debt owed which at my said wifes decease
 I give my son Joseph
- 2nd I give to my daughter baby Shields during her natural
 life one negro man named Sam & one girl named Esther
 & at her my said daughters death the said negroes with
 future increase to be equally divided among her
 children
- 3rd I give to my daughter Esther Casley during her natural life
 one negro man named Guy, one girl named Rene & one
 named Leah, with their future increase & at her death
 the said negroes with their increase to be equally divided
 among her children
- 4th I give to my grand children the children of my daughter
 Morgan Brown one negro man named Ben & one girl
 named Hannah with her future increase
