that it is appointed unto all men once to die do make &
renew this my last will & testament in manner & form
following to wit

First of all I give my soul unto God who gave it &
secondly I give my body to be buried in Christian burial order
thirdly as respects my worldly goods I give and bequeath
unto Caroline House one bed & full furniture Elizabeth
children also one bed & full furniture Elizabeth Isabella
House one bed & full furniture Francis Murcott House
also one bed & full furniture also the house hold & kitchen
furniture to be divided between Caroline House & Adeline
House the room & all the furniture to belong to Ann House
at the white castle Bagg & Church & give to be divided
between Caroline House & Adeline House My big chest
& cupboard to Elizabeth Chandler Barlog's wife of Murcott
apartment in the city I should marry one dollar & fifty
cents and so on if not you can have chosen of the man
or lost

The other creature to be divided between Samuel Barlog
House John Jeremiah Thomas House Ship Littlebury House
