Thomas Neal of Georgia Franklin County do hereby make
my last will & testament this nineteenth day of April
one thousand eight hundred eighteen in manner of the
following that is to say,

I desire that all my horses cattle & hogs houses & furniture
& all my other portable property not above mentioned
may be sold & out of the money arising therefrom all
my just debts & funeral expenses be paid

After payment of my debts & funeral expenses I give to my loving
wife Ruth Neal one third part of the remainder pecuniary

I give to my daughter Peggy W. Neal the other two thirds of the
remainder of the money arising from the sale above mentioned
I leave to my loving wife Ruth Neal one third part of all
my lands during her natural life

My will & desire is that my daughter Peggy W. Neal
may have the use of the other two thirds of my lands to
support & to school her

After the decease of my wife Ruth Neal I give to my
daughter Peggy W. Neal all my land to her then heirs
forever, And I hereby do hereby constitute & appoint my
friend Joseph Brodrick & my wife Ruth Neal executors
to execute in this my last will & testament

Thomas Pennington, I wish the use of my blacksmiths tools
James McPhee, to go to the use & educating of my child

Item 2^d I give & bequeath to my dearly beloved wife Sarah
Lambert four negroes namely Harry & his child Mary and
Bobby a negro male & Grizzy & all the personal property that
is in her hands possession at the time such as household
furniture &c together with the one or two slaves
whereon she now bears & resides the said personal property
to belong to the said Sarah Lambert & during her life time
& at her death if any left to be equally divided amongst
my children hereafter mentioned except the negro above
mentioned which negro is to be at her sole disposal

Item 3^e I give & bequeath to my son Alexander Braggs alias Carter
a negro girl Judy, & two negro boys Harrison & Bailey

Item 4th I give & bequeath to my son Washington Braggs alias Lambert
