My will & desire is that my daughter Peggy W. Neel
may have the use of the other two thirds of my lands to
support & to school her

After the decease of my wife Ruth Neel I give to my
daughter Peggy W. Neel all my land to her then heirs
forever, And I hereby constitute & appoint my
friends Joseph B. Warr, & my wife Ruth Neel executor
& executrix of this my last will & Testament
