That is to say, principally and first of all. I give and recommend my soul into the hand of almighty God that gave it, and my body I recommend to the Earth to be buried in a decent Christian burial at the discretion of my executor, nothing doubting but at the general resurrection, I shall receive the same again by the mighty power of God - And as touching such worldly estate wherewith it has pleased God to bless me in this life - I give, devise and dispose of the same in the following manner and form - (Viz) First - I give and bequeath to ~~Elizabeth~~ ^{my} dear beloved wife one hundred acres of land whereon I now live lying on the waters of Flat Creek, in the County of Jackson, adjoining William Gyles and others, together with one Horse and plough and gear, and one hoe & axe, and Choice of my stock of two Cows & Calves, one bed and furniture, and all my hogs and Sheep, two pigs and a Kettle during her life and after her death all the remains of the above named property to be sold and divided equally between my heirs that is to say, between my five sons, (Viz) Adam, John, Henry, Thomas, and Levi - And I do hereby appoint Mr. son Adam and Levi Philips my lawful Executors to dispose of the estate in the manner and form before mentioned - and I do hereby utterly disallow revoke and disannul all and every other former Testaments wills, and bequeathes, and executors by me in any wise before named, willed, bequeathed, Ratifying and Confirming this and no other to be my last will and Testament -
