 & all the money owing to me in Kentucky, also my horse saddle
 & bridle to my daughter Mary Beavers signed sealed & delivered in the
 presence of Charles Shields, Mary Freeman, James Shields this
 1st of December 1825, Entered into before signed

Georgia In the name of God, Amen.
 Jackson County, I Thomas M. Wilson of ^{Said} State & County
 & County being sick but of sound mind & memory
 calling to mind the mortality of my body knowing that
 it is appointed for all ^{persons} ~~men~~ to die do hereby give this my
 last will & testament as follows
 First I recommend my soul to God, & my body to my mother
 to be interred at the discretion of my heirs, executors & ad-
 ministrator. I do my will that all my last debts be paid by my
 executors & the balance of my estate should be divided & paid
 to my wife & me if my will that it be divided in the
 following manner. Now it is my will that a negro girl
 called Fena & any increase which may be of her body be
 equally divided between my daughter Nancy E. Wilson and

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Child or children ^{which} my wife Polly Wilson may be desirous
 of which she may now be pregnant with & if either of
 of the said children should die without issue its part
 is to fall to the surviving child or children.
 My plantation lands & improvements, whereon I now reside
 I leave to my wife Polly Wilson during her life or
 widowhood & then it to be divided till the children all
 are lawfully authorized to act for themselves, I leave
 the same to my wife Polly Wilson who is to divide each
 Child one sixth & so much of the cash stock & furniture
 as will satisfy the demands against my estate is to be
 sold & if there be more sold than will satisfy the demands
 against my estate it to be put to interest till all my
 children be authorized to act for themselves then to be equally
 divided between them that is my living children each one of
 the said children is to have a court calf when they marry or
 arrive to the age of twenty years it is my will that my executor
 see that my children be liberally ^{one} educated out of my estate
 And such of the stock & the furniture as may be thought necessary
 for the support comfort & convenience of my family is to be
 retained unsold. It is my will that my wife Polly Wilson
 have one bed as her sole right & furniture thereof and
 the balance of bedding & furniture to be equally divided
 between my living children, I do hereby revoke all wills
 & testaments heretofore made by me and I do hereby nomi-
 nate & appoint my wife Polly Wilson & James P. Rogers
 my sole executors to see that the whole of this my last
 will & testament be executed In witness whereof I have this
 day at my house & seal this fifteenth day of August
 one thousand eight hundred & twenty eight of the independ-
 ence of the united states the fifty third, signed and
 acknowledged in the presence of

 1st I give & bequeath unto my wife Nancy Orr five dollars in money
 2^d I give & bequeath unto my wife's daughter Martha Swinton Orr ten Dollars in money
 3^d I give & bequeath unto my wife's son Thomas Orr ten Dollars in money
 4th I give & bequeath unto my wife's daughter Anna Orr ten dollars in money
 5th I will & bequeath unto my three children John Orr Jr., Rebecca Wilson, & Susan Miller all my property both real & personal to be equally divided between them having no reference to any property that I have given & delivered to them before this time but before this division shall be made my executor will pay all my Just debts & the legacies left in money to my wife & three children the debts & monies so to be paid they sitting any property my executor may think best & in any way they may think best & most advantageous to my estate
 I nominate & appoint John Orr Jr. & James Barr my executors to this my last will & testament in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal the 10th day of April 1828
