

Georgia — I Travis Nixon of the County & State  
 Jackson County, aforesaid being of sound mind and disposing memory, and taking in Consideration the Certainty of death and the uncertainty of the time when, do make, ordain, the following, my last will and Testament. (Viz) In the first place, I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Susannah, my Negroes, Jim, Phill, Gashua, Squire, Ginney, Gillah, Lettisha, Lucy, and Oliver, and their increase during her natural life - also the whole of the plantation on which I now live during her natural life - also all my household and Kitchen furniture during her life - I also give and bequeath unto my said wife, my Gin, my Waggon, and all my plantation tools, and all my Credits & all my personal property, except hereinafter bequeathed, and to pay all my just debts, and all my Cash legacies. I further give and bequeath unto my wife as aforesaid a tract or lot of land in Lee County, and a lot of land in the gold Region which I have lately drawn, in the late Gold Lottery for the purpose of assisting in the payment of my just debts, all of which is to be subject to the payment of my just debt, and the remainder to be for her use and benefit during her natural life, and after her death to be equally divided among six of my Children to wit, Lydia Strawberry, Henry Nixon, Elizabeth Archer, William Nixon, John Nixon, & Sarah Collier.

Secondly, I give and bequeath unto my daughter Lydia Strawberry my Negro Pellow named Claiborn. I give and bequeath unto my son Henry Nixon, my Negro Boy Belle. I give and bequeath unto my son William Nixon my Negro boy Porter. I give and bequeath unto my son John Nixon my two negro Boys Nelson and Frank. I give and bequeath unto my daughter Sally Collier my Negro boy named Mingo. I give and bequeath unto my daughter Elizabeth Archer three hundred dollars in Cash within twelve months after my decease - I give and bequeath unto my daughter Rebecca Robinson five dollars in Cash. I give and bequeath unto my son-in-law Isaac Knoxe, one dollar. I give and bequeath unto Dianna Allen formerly wife of my son Capley Nixon, one dollar - I hereby appoint my wife Susannah Executrix and Asa Varnum Executor of this

my last will and Testament. In testimony whereunto I set my hand and seal this 9th day of May 1833. Travis Nixon Seal

Georgia - I Absalom Wafford of the County & State aforesaid being Jackson County, and infirm of body but of sound mind & memory, wishing to settle my worldly affairs do make and ordain my last will and testament in manner & form following that first. I will that all my just debts, honestly & punctually paid. Secondly. It is my will that all the estate after the payment of debts as I have directed which I may have at the time of my death be divided among my children and Grand Children as follows that is to my Grand daughter, Eliza Wafford, one horse, & one Cow, & one Bed & my household & Kitchen furniture - Thirdly - To my daughter Hannah Wallace, one Bed - Fourthly - To my Grand son John Wafford, all my tools of every kind fifthly - all the property not named in the above will to go to the payment of my debts at the pleasure of my Executor - And lastly - I do hereby nominate & appoint my Son-in-law John Wallace Executor of this my last will and testament.
