I then I desire & desire that my well beloved wife Mary shall enjoy the
use of the Plantation on which I now reside during her life time
& also the interest arising from my lands & money

I then I desire & desire that my said wife Mary shall also have the use
of all the stock household & kitchen furniture farming tools &c
in my possession on such as may be awarded me at my decease
I then I desire & desire that at the death of my wife Mary all my property
shall be equally divided amongst my children

I then I desire & desire & do hereby constitute my friend Robert White Executor
of this my last will & Testament & do hereby authorize him the
said Executor to sell my said should it become necessary so
to do this August 29th 1853
