 I William Allen of State & County aforesaid being very low weak in body but of sound mind & memory wishing to settle my worldly affairs do make this my last will & testament hereby revoking all other wills by me heretofore made
 First It is my will that all my just debt to be paid out of my estate by my executor hereafter to be named
 Item I bequeath unto my wife Elizabeth Allen one negro woman named Sally & her child Anthony together with all my household & kitchen furniture to her & her heirs & assigns forever
 Item I bequeath unto four sons to wit, William Robert

Do hereby bequeath four negroes to wit Rose, Pinner, Grace & Willey to their
white heirs & assigns, but one negro to each of my said sons & it is my
Will that they shall draw for the same by having each of said negro
names wrote seperately & put into a box or some other convenient
thing & they to do so for themselves & each legatee to have the negro
he shall so draw to be put into their possession as they may see fit
of ^{lawful} age & if it is further my Will that if one of said negroes should
die after the aforesaid distribution & before my youngest son has right
to receive his said legacy that then & in that case each of my said sons
shall bear an equal suffer in such loss the said negroes to be and
remain on the plantation with my wife for the benefit of raising
my said children untill they marry or become of lawful age
or be hired out for their use as it shall appear best to my
executors

Item it is my Will that my negro fellow George he & remain
on my plantation untill next Spring to help repair the farm
thereafter that to be sold or continued on the plantation
at the discretion of my executors & in case the said negro George
is sold the money arising from such sale to be laid out
for land or put to any other use that my executors may think
most advantageous for my family & in either event my wife & son
sons to be equally interested in said negro

Item it is my Will that my stock of horses, cattle & sheep be
to remain on my plantation & with my family for their support
except two young fillies which I wish sold & also my blacksmiths
tools for the immediate support of my family & in case my
Should Marry that the stock that shall be then remaining shall be
equally divided among my children & if my executors shall
think it best to keep the youngest of the two fillies above mentioned
untill she be grown they may use their discretion in that case

It is my Will that my outstanding debts be collected & applied
to the use of paying all the Just debts that I owe & the overplus if there
be any be applied to the use of my family

Lastly I appoint my wife Elizabeth Allen & my trusty friend Hugh
Montgomery executors & executor to this my last Will and
testament I witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand this

last will & testament In presence of them I first bequeath my
soul to almighty God from whence it came & my body to the trust
to be buried in a decent manner in the earth from whence it came
My will & desire is that my wife Christian Walker shall have during
her life or widowhood all & singular my good & chattles to wit lands
& tenements except forty acres of the tract known as on which is
the same comprehended in this will which said forty acres I give
unto my daughter Jane Paulson during her life & then to
return to my son Alathon Walker the said forty acres to be
landed off on the west side of the creek running down with
the creek & line for the complement of land Also all my negro
household & kitchen furniture stock of every kind & with every
other article that I may be possessed of my desire is provided the
the said Christian Walker & heirs the said negroes will others
wise they may go the Negroes hereafter mentioned & the property
& the property above described is to remain & kept together on
the plantation during the life or widowhood of my wife Christian
Walker & then to be distributed in the manner following
Item my will is that my negro woman Lucy be sold and the
money equally divided among my children as Jonathan Walker
My daughter Jane & my daughter Jane Paulson & Elizabeth
