following hereby revoking all other will or wills by me heretofore
made (that is to say)

First is my Will that all my Just debts be paid out of my estate by my executors hereafter named & that property I have bequeath in the following manner.

I then I give & bequeath to my beloved wife Jane Headen the tract of land whereon I now live with the appertanances, the plantation tools household & other furniture two negroes to wit Sam & Mary & my bay horse three cows (her choice) half the hog run sitting on the plantation. At my ^{desire} ~~decease~~ to to be buried ^{here} in our natural life & then he devoted among my children to wit, William, Shadrach James Robertson David Robertson James Turner Henry Turner William L. Bagwell who intermarried with my daughters, Wm Headen George Headen, Eli Headen & Jesse Headen (my sons) I give & bequeath unto Elizabeth Headen wife of John Headen & Sally Powell my grand daughter five shillings each I give to my son in law Allen Headen & my son Robert Headen five shillings each.

The balance of my estate not here in disposed of
I will that it be divided into twelve equal shares with
out a sale if it can be done, but if my heirs cannot
agree in the division of the property for it to be sold
and the money to be divided into twelve equal parts
one of the said parts to my son in law William Steel,
one other part to my son in law James Robertson
one other part to my son in law David Robertson
one other part to my son in law Henry Gurnor
one other part to my son in law Wm P. Maguire
to them & their heirs forever, one other part to my son
Wm Headen, one other part to my son George Headen
one other part to my son Eli Headen, & one other
part to my son Jesse Headen to them & their heirs

forwards the two remaining parts I wish to be put in the hands of my two sons William Headen & George Headen & to be by them disposed of as they may see fit for the use of Robert Headen my son, & my daughter Rify Headen, Lestley Saphoritt my two sons Wm Headen & George Headen my executors to this my last will & testament, In witness whereof I have unto set my hand & seal this 24th day of November 1807
