Georgia I William Ward being much afflicted  
Jackson County & conscious of my approaching death and  
having bound in mind make this my last will & testament  
to give & bequeath unto my wife Rachael after paying all my  
just debts, the land & documents which I now have in my possession  
named Rose, one named Lucy, one named Dice, one small girl  
then, one little boy Louis, together all the stock horses hogs  
& cattle, household & kitchen furniture during her lifetime  
& at her death to be divided in manner hereinafter directed  
But provided she should marry, she is to have the idem an  
Dice & one bid, one acre & half acre beside the balance of the  
property to be divided between my children by my present wife  
with the exception of one hundred dollars, which to be equally  
divided between my first children or their representation to the  
fourth part of the estate four years after my death the balance  
of my property after my wife's death in marriage is to be equal-  
ly divided between my present wife's children with the exception  
of one daughter Maria which is to have two hundred dollars  
more, than anyone of the others. In testimony whereof I have

divided between my daughter Margaret & son Joseph &  
Isaac C. Wallis together with all my debts to be by them  
settled Item 2<sup>d</sup> I also give to my said wife one lot of  
land in Early County known distinguished by lot No 1<sup>st</sup>
