my wife as aforesaid, I give to my son Josiah Wickman my
tract of land purchased of Morton including my mill and
cotton Machine still & distillery also my negro of old name
Hannah, Then I give to my son William Wickman at the
decease of my wife as aforesaid that tract of land whereon I now
live containing one hundred acres also I give to my son
Theophilus one dollar out of my estate he having in my
estimation already received his part, I give to my son
Nathaniel, one dollar he having already recd his
part I give to my son Jacob five dollars he having already
had his quota, I give to my daughter Lucretia H. Miller
one dollar she having had her part as above
I give to my daughter Sarah Castleberry she having
previously had her part, I give to my daughter James
Whitcomb one dollar as she has before received her part
And at the decease of my wife as aforesaid I will that
the balance of my estate both real & personal including
Debts due & ready money together with the increase of
of Slaves shall be equally divided amongst my five daugh-
ters, Viz, Susan, Danna, Niza, Graceland, & Eliza Morney
Nowaring, Heath & Christina Thomas & his family
Constitute & appoint my son Josiah Wickman and
my son in law Richard Heath to be my executors of this
my last will & testament. In witness whereof I do hereunto
set my hand & seal this fifteenth day of May one thousand
eight hundred & six years

In the name of God, Amen. The sixth day of June in the
 year of our Lord eight hundred & three, I Jacob Gideon Junior of
 Jackson County in the State of Georgia being under an indisposition
 of body but of sound sense & disposing memory thanks be to God for
 all his mercies & call to mind the transitoriness of this life that
 it is appointed for all men once to die do make & ordain this my
 last will & testament, in manner & form following, viz, first
 My will & desire is that all my just debts & funeral charges
 be justly & fully paid by my executors hereafter named
 I then give & bequeath to my wife Elizabeth Gideon my negro girl
 Rachael to be to her proper use to help & assist to raise
 my children, & my body more I likewise give to her
 the land whereon I now live to be rented until my
 sons Hosea & Perry come of age & the profits arising
 therefrom to be put to the best use for my children when
 they come of age the said land to be equally divided between
 them by their honest men appointed by me after named
 executors. I then also give to my wife Elizabeth my two beds
 & furniture, likewise my cupboard furniture, all my stock
 & all my other unbequeathed property I allow to be sold at
 twelve months credit then monies to be collected & put to
 interest I allow my two sons to get good education so as to
 be made good English Schollars. The money arising from
 the rent of my land & the sale of my property I allow to
 be put the use of raising & educating my sons & lastly
 I do appoint Doctor Harten & William McFutchen both
