of my faculties here is at hand in discharge of my duty to my family  
to make & declare this my last Will & Testament as follows

Item I give in manner & form following

Item I give & bequeath to my wife Pricilla Morgan one negro woman  
named Emily who increase during her natural life then to be divid-  
ed equally amongst my children also I leave all my horses cattle  
hogs, sheep & geese together with my beds household furniture  
trading tools of all kinds a machine with all such as shall be  
judged necessary to be sold for the payment of my debts. To my  
wife Pricilla to her use & the use of my children so she remain  
in widowhood then to be equally divided amongst my children

Item I give & bequeath to my daughter Patsy the negro one neg-  
o girl named Thelma which she has in possession

Item I give to my son Blake Morgan one negro boy named <sup>Adams</sup> ~~John~~

Item I give & bequeath to my son William Morgan one Neg-  
ro boy named Peter

Item I give & bequeath to my son Jesse Morgan one negro boy <sup>John</sup>  
by name

Item I give & bequeath to my three youngest daughters Pricilla  
Morgan Esther Morgan & Mahala Morgan  
two negro girls named Dilce, & Sina, with all their  
in estate to be equally divided between them the  
said Pricilla, Esther, & Mahala when the said Pricilla  
shall be of lawful age

Item My will is that all my land shall be sold at the discre-  
tion of my executors & that my daughter Joice have sixty  
dollars the money arising from the sale of said land  
also that my son Jesse have twenty dollars out of the said  
money, the balance of the money of said land I leave to the  
discretion of my executors to purchase a tract of land for  
the support of my family or divide it with all my children  
I hereby nominate and appoint Saml. Gray & my wife  
Pricilla Morgan whole, sole, executors to this my last

will & testament in witness whereof I Morgans do set my hand & seal this 10th day of April 1809 signed sealed & delivered in presence of

Georgia, Phillip Avery being weak in body Jackson County, but in perfect health of mind & ability to mind the mortality of my body, knowing that it was appointed for all men once to die, I therefore do constitute & ordain this as my last will & testament And first of all I do bequeath <sup>to bequeath</sup> my soul into the hands of almighty God, & my body to be buried in common ~~decent~~ <sup>to the earth</sup> Christian burial And next I do bequeath to my dear Loving wife Betsey my plantation that I now live on with all my farming tools together with my Waggon & three work horses & all my stock of cattle & hogs & all negroes viz, Betty, Betsey, Chavis, Malinda, Patsy & others, with all my household furniture & my sheep during her life And to my daughter Betsey I do bequeath a negro girl named Hannah together with a bed & furniture & a man & calf that she now has also a cow & calf And to my son William I bequeath a negro boy named Job & the half of my tract of land in Morgan County a bed & furniture & the horse that he has already got & cow & calf Also I do bequeath to my son Thomas a negro boy called Ben & the other half of my tract of land in Morgan County a bed
