

Georgia In the name of God Amen I William Morgan
 Last Son County of the State Kentucky aforesaid being in sound
 mind & memory but in a low state of health & retaining the time
 of my death here is at hand in discharge of my duty to my family
 do make & declare this my last Will & Testament as follows

First I give in manner & form following

I give & bequeath to my wife Pricilla Morgan one negro woman
 named Emily who increase during her natural life then to be divi-
 ded equally amongst my children also I leave all my horses cattle
 hogs, sheep & geese together with my beds & household furniture
 & things of all kinds a machine & still except such as shall be
 judged necessary to be sold for the payment of my debts. To my
 wife Pricilla to her use & the use of my children so she remain
 in widowhood then to be equally divided amongst my children

Second I give & bequeath to my daughter Patsy the piece of my
 girl named Thelma which she has in possession

Third I give to my son Blake Morgan one negro boy named ^{Adams} ~~the~~

Fourth I give & bequeath to my son William Morgan Ned

Fifth I give & bequeath to my daughter Lizzie Morgan one neg-
 ro boy named Peter

Sixth I give & bequeath to my son Jesse Morgan one negro boy ~~the~~
 by name

Seventh I give & bequeath to my three youngest daughters Pricilla
 Morgan Esther Morgan & Mahala Morgan
 two negro girls named Dilce, & Vena, with all their
 in or out to be equally divided between them the
 said Pricilla, Esther, & Mahala when the said Pricilla
 shall be of lawful age

Eighth My will is that all my land shall be sold at the discre-
 tion of my executors & that my daughter Lizzie have sixty
 dollars the money arising from the sale of said land
 also that my son Jesse have twenty dollars out of the said
 money, the balance of the money of said land I leave to the
 discretion of my executors to purchase a tract of land for
 the support of my family or divide it with all my children
 Ninth I nominate and appoint Samuels Gray & my wife
 Pricilla Morgan whole, sole, executors to this my last

will & testament in witness whereof Morgans do set my
hand & seal this 10th day of April 1809 signed sealed
& delivered in presence of
James Rogers William Morgan (L.S.)

they did see William Morgan sign the within will

Georgia, I Phillip Avery being weak in body
Jackson County, but in perfect health of mind & ability
to mind the mortality of my body, knowing that it was
appointed for all men once to die, I therefore do constitute
& ordain this as my last will & testament And first
of all I do ^{bequeath} ~~bequeath~~ my soul into the hands of
almighty God, & my body to be buried in common ~~burial~~
decent Christian burial And next I do bequeath to my
dear Loving wife Betsey my plantation that I now live on
with all my farming tools together with my Waggon & three
work horses, all my stock of cattle & hogs & all my negroes viz,
Betsey, Betsey, Chavis, Malinda, Patsy & others, with
all my household furniture & my sheep during her life
And to my daughter Betsey I do bequeath a negro girl
named Nance together with a bed & furniture &
a mare & colt that she now has also a cow & calf
And to my son William I bequeath a negro boy named
Jost & the half of my tract of land in Morgan
County a bed & furniture & the horse that he has
already got & a cow & calf Also I do bequeath to my
son Thomas a negro boy called Ben & the other half
of my tract of land in Morgan County a bed
