 Carolina or in Georgia. And secondly I give & bequeath to

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Eakin after my Just debts being well & truly paid out of
the same, Ratifying & confirming this to and no other
be my last will & Testament. In Witness whereof I have
hereunto set my hand & seal this fifteenth day of October
Eighteen hundred two. Signed sealed published pronounced
declared by the said William Newton as his last will and
Testament in presence of us who in his presence & in the
presence of each other have hereunto subscribed our names
