

George 3. In the name of God Amen I William Thurmond Do This Day
Jackson County 19th of May Eighteen Hundred & fifty eight make this my last
Will & Testament first of all I command my Slave to god who have it & my
Body to be respectfully Entombed My property to be disposed of in the following
Manner

1st after my Death my Will is that all my just debts be paid out of my Effects
I desire to be buried with my beloved wife Firmly I therefore all of the land
whereon I now live together with all of the house hold & Kitchen furniture
all of my Horses property & horses, cows, hogs, stock of all sorts, with all
of the farming & plantation tools to have during her Natural life or
widowhood. If beloved wife should die long at any time to divide any
of the aforesaid property she has the Right to do so Equally between all
of my children by me begotten hereafter named

2nd I further will that at my beloved wife death that my Daughter Mary & son
Eliza Thurmond who I have never given any land shall be made equal
with the rest of my children that has had land

3rd after my beloved wife Death my Will is that all my property shall be
Equally divided among all of my children after making the two children
above named up Equal with the rest of my children

4th I ordain & constitute John Sampkin, my Lawfull Executor & I further
desire & acknowledge this to be my last Will & Testament
