

Georgia, } Know all men by these presents, that I, William
Jackson County, } Williamson of the State and County aforesaid, do
make and publish this my last will and testament.

- 1st I give and devise to my Nephew James Williamson McCleskey, one hundred and fifty acres of land, to be laid off to him from the lower end of the tract now in my possession on Carries Creek.
- 2nd I give and devise to my Nephew Cusebys McCleskey, One hundred and ten acres of land to be laid off from the upper end of the above mentioned tract.
- 3rd I give and bequeath to Adam Williamson One other hundred acres of land to be laid off next adjoining the last mentioned portion to be held in trust by him, to be conveyed to my Nephew Madison West McCleskey, whenever said Adam may believe him of sufficient economy to use the same to advantage.
- 4th I give and bequeath the balance of said tract of land in like manner to Adam Williamson, to be divided by him and conveyed to Milton T. McCleskey and William G. McCleskey, when ever he may think proper as mentioned in the last aforesaid item.
- 5th I devise to my Nephew James Moon two lots of land to wit: lot No 167 in the 20th District of Early County in said State, and lot No 147, 9th district of Houston County of said State.
- 6th I devise to my Nephew Jackson Moon, two lots of land to wit: lot No 62 in 5th Early, and lot No 21 in the 13th district of Houston County, both in said State.
- 7th I devise to my Nephew Hartwell Moon, two lots of land in said State to wit: lot No 221 in the 10th Early, and lot No 166 in the 12th Early.
- 8th I devise to my Nephew Jesse Moon two lots of land lying in Appling County of said State, to wit: lot No 97 in the 8th district, and lot No 180 in the 7th district.
- 9th I devise to my Nephew Robert Moon one lot of land to wit: lot No 46 in the first district of Lee County of said State.
- 10th I devise to my Sister Jimmy Cobb a life estate to one lot of land lying in Gwinnett County of said State, known as lot No 378 in the 7th District of said County, and at her death, I devise the same to her children then living.
- 11th I devise my portion of a tract of land owned jointly by myself and Adam Williamson, lying in the County of Jackson, known as the Horton tract to Cusebys J. McCleskey, James W. McCleskey, Madison W. McCleskey,

Nitton T. McEliskey, William S. McEliskey, Caroline McEliskey, Margaret McEliskey, Mary McEliskey, and Elizabeth McEliskey - The said Adam to sell the same when ever he thinks proper, and the proceeds to be divided equally; also the annual profits of the same until a sale be made -

- 12th I bequeath whatever land I may be entitled to of the land drawn by Polir Moon (whose chances in present lottery I have purchased) to Hawthell Moon, James Moon, Jackson Moon, Jesse Moon, Robert Moon, Eliza Moon and Betty Moon, all my Nephews and Nieces, to be equally divided between them -
- 13th I give whatever lands I may draw to my own name in the present lottery to such of the Children of my Sister Polly McEliskey, as I have herein made legates -
- 14th I give to my half Brother, James Mitchell, my equitable portion of a tract of land the title of which is in Adam Williamson, lying in the third district of Houston County which was drawn by Abner Sailors, the same to be paid by said Adam by annual instalments, of fifty dollars to said James Mitchell -
- 15th I bequeath to my Niece Elizabeth McEliskey four hundred dollars to be raised out of my debts due me -
- 16th I bequeath to my Niece Eliza Moon four hundred dollars, to be raised out of debts due to me -
- 17th I bequeath to my Niece Elizabeth Moon two hundred dollars to be raised out of my debts -
- 18th I bequeath to my Nephew Robert Moon four hundred dollars to be paid out of debts due me -
- 19th I bequeath to the Children of my Sister Betsey Power three hundred dollars to be paid them in equal portions as they arrive of full age -
- 20th I bequeath to the Children of my Sister Jane Coff three hundred dollars to be equally divided and to be paid when they arrive of full age -
- 21st I give my Negro boy Charles and Ishmael to my Nephew James McEliskey, in trust to be held until his youngest Brother becomes of full age, then to be sold by him, and the proceeds to be equally divided among such of my Nephews and Nieces of the Children of my Sister Polly McEliskey as I have herein made my legates -
- 22d I give a life estate of my Negro Girl FINE, to my Sister Sarah Moon and after her death to be sold, and the proceeds of the sale to be equally divided among such of her Children as are herein made legates -
- 23d I bequeath my Negro Girl Mary, to my Niece Caroline McEliskey -
- 24th I bequeath my Negro Girl Louise to my Niece Margaret McEliskey -
- 25th I bequeath my Negro Girl Emily to my Niece Mary McEliskey -

24th I bequeath my Negro Boy west, to my Nephew, William I. McCleskey.
 27th All the balance of my personal property I wish to be sold and the proceeds of the sale to be equally divided among the children of my sister Polly McCleskey, as are herein made legatees, to be paid to each in like manner as directed in their former legacies, except one horse which is to be reserved for my Nephew James W. McCleskey he having his chance. But it is herein provided that in case the debts due me be insufficient to pay my money and specific legacies, then and in that case the same is to be made up of the proceeds of the sale of the property herein directed to be sold.

28th I do hereby nominate and appoint Adam Williamson my Executor to execute this my last will and Testament.
