I Bartlett Brown of the County of Jasper & State of Georgia, being weak in body, but of sound disposing mind and measured as such, and constitute this my last will & Testament. —

Item 1st It is my will and desire that after my death my property be inventoried in the usual manner but that all my property both real & personal remain unsold for the support and comfort of my wife & children, during the natural life or widowhood of my Wife. —

Item 2^d It is my will and desire that all my I not debts be paid and if it should become necessary to sell any of my property for that or any other purpose, then my will and desire that my executor, have full power and authority to sell at private sale any of my property either real or personal.

Item 3^d It is my will and desire, that if my Executors should at any time think it would be for the advantage of my Wife and children to sell any piece of property either real or personal and purchase other property that they have full power and authority to sell at private sale, if they should think best and purchase again taking titles so that the property shall be equal between my Wife and each of my children.

Item 4th It is my will and desire that if off of my property there should be a surplus over and above a support for my wife and children, that such surplus be laid out by my Executors

mind and means to do so and constitute this my
last will & Testament. —

Item 1st It is my will and desire that after my death

Item 2^d It is my will and desire that all my

property that they have full power and authority
to sell at private sale, if they should think best
and purchase again taking title so that the property
shall be equal between my Wife and each of my

Item 4th It is my will and desire, that if off
of my property there should be a surplus over and
above a support for my wife and children,
that such surplus be laid out by my Executors
for such property as my family need and that the
titles of such property be so taken as to be equal
between my wife and each of my children. —

Item 5th It is my Will and desire that at the death or intermarriage of my Wife, that an equal distribution of my property take place between my wife provided she should marry and each of my children and equally between my children in case of the death of my Wife.

Item 6th It is my will and desire that my wife Parthena Brown and my friend Matthew Whitfield and my brother William Brown be my true and lawful Executors to carry this my last will and testament into full and complete effect.
