Georgia Jasper County I David Montgomery being sick of body but sound in mind, but as it is once appointed for man to die I make this my last Will & Testament, to wit: I gave and bequeath to my beloved wife Elizabeth Montgomery for her own use during her natural life or widowhood all this lot of land whereon we now live with all its appurtenances two horses and gig, household and kitchen furniture and plantation tools, cattle hogs and sheep as much as she needs and servants, Daniel Juden, Peggy, Selay, Sally, and Emily and a sufficiency of the crop for her support the ensuing year and it is my will at her natural death that all she may possess may be equally divided among the Legates after named in the following scale, and I do not knowing the amount either of the first division at my death or the second division at my wifes death but when that sum is estimated that I David Montgomery do gave and bequeath James H. Montgomery all that he has already received all that may fall to him on an accurate division of the whole. I also gave and bequeath to my first-born daughter Jane Davis all that she has already received and all that may fall to her on an accurate division of the whole to her, and her children at her death. I also gave and bequeath to my second daughter Elizabeth Hurst all she has got already and her full part that shall fall to her on an accurate division of the whole to her and her children after after her death. And I also gave and bequeath to my two grand daughters Elizabeth W. Bellamy & Grimmers in addition to what they have already rec^d one negro girl by the name of Hannah to be kept by the Executors till they come of age or marry, and if they should die without leaving any are to remain in this Estate. And to my second son David H. Montgomery I do gave and bequeath what he has already rec^d and his full part of all the Estate when divided. I also gave and bequeath to my daughter Susan S. Jenkins what she has already rec^d and all that shall fall to her on an accurate division of the whole to her and her children at her death. I also gave and bequeath to my son Benjamin H. Montgomery his equal part first with the married children and then his full part to him in an accurate division of the whole at our death. I also gave and bequeath to my daughter Ann W. Wilkerson all that full part she has already received and all that shall fall to her on an accurate division of the whole at our death.

And I will that all the remaining part of my Estate after all just debts is paid be equally divided among my Eight now living children after the present crop is completed.

And now moreover I do by these presents make, constitute, ordain & appoint my beloved wife Elizabeth Montgomery Executrix and my oldest son James H. Montgomery Executor to carry into effect this my last will and Testament and all and every article or articles in the foregoing have a fair and liberal construction.
