Item 1. It is my will and desire that the proceeds
of my present crop together with my crop of cotton
now on hand be applied to the payment of all my last
debts, under the management of my Executors, hereinafter
named - Item 2. I will and bequeath to my beloved
wife Elizabeth Boykin my two negroes viz. Shade and
Charlotte, also one black horse by the name of Dick.

Item 3. I will and bequeath to my beloved son John F.
Boykin my three negroes, viz. Israel, Patty & George.

Item 4. I will and bequeath to my beloved son William
Boykin my three negroes viz. Sam. Mosey & Mose.
also one half square of land in said County
which I purchased from Stephen Duke.

Item 5. I will and bequeath to the heirs of my
beloved Daughter Martha I. Sample, my three negroes,
viz. Joe, Kate and John which negroes I desire
that my daughter Martha shall have the full
benefit of, during her natural life and then to go to her
children.

Item 6. I will and bequeath to my son J. M. Boykin
my three negroes viz. Daniel, Presley and Doctor
and also the sum of four hundred dollars annually out
of my property not herein otherwise disposed of for the purpose
of giving him a liberal education, which annual sum
is to continue untill he has graduated at College and
studied whatever profession he may choose to follow and
underwent the tuition on the same, which annual sum
is to be managed by my executors for the purpose named
as they may think best untill he arrives at the age of
twenty one years. — 100.

Item 4th. I will and bequeath to my beloved son William P. Boykin, my three negroes viz. Levi, Nancy & Mose, and also one half square of land in said County which I purchased from Stephen Duke.

Item 5th. I will and bequeath to the heirs of my beloved Daughter Martha J. Sample, my three negroes, viz. John, Peter & Mary. I desire that my daughter Martha shall have the full benefit of, during her natural life and then to go to her children.

Item 6th. I will and bequeath to my son Jephth. Boykin my three negroes viz. Daniel, Popsy and Doctor and also the sum of four hundred dollars annually out of my property not herein otherwise disposed of for the purpose of giving him a liberal education, which annual sum is to continue untill he has graduated at College and studied whatever profession he may choose to follow and underwent the tuition on the same, which annual sum is to be managed by my executor for the purpose named as they may think best untill he arrives at the age of twenty one years. — 100

Item 7th. I will and bequeath to my beloved Daughter Ann D. Boykin, my three negroes viz. Jerry, young Albert & Lenny.

Item 8th. I will and bequeath to my beloved Son Sterling Boykin my three negroes, viz. Sam, Tempy & Sarah.

- Item 9.th I will and bequeath to my beloved Daughter Rebecca Boykin, my three negroes to wit Fred. Caroline & old Patty -
- Item 10.th I will and bequeath to my beloved son Francis A. Boykin my three negroes viz. Eli, Mary & Fanny -
- Item 11.th I will and bequeath to my beloved Daughter Margaret. Boykin my four negroes viz. Margaret. Phoebe, Aaron & old Abby -
- Item 12.th It is my will and desire that all my land not otherwise disposed of be kept together for the support of the family untill my son Jesse W. Boykin comes to the age of twenty one years, at which time the land is to be equally divided into four parts, one of which parts I will to my wife Elizabeth Boykin, another of which parts I will to my son Jesse W. Boykin, another of which parts I will to my son Sterling Boykin, and the other of which parts I will to my son Francis A. Boykin each one to receive their equal parts as they come of age or call for them. I further provide that if my wife Elizabeth Boykin should die before my youngest son comes to the age of twenty one years a division of the said lands immediately to take place under the direction of my executors herein after named together with all other property which may be left subject to future distribution among my heirs by this will -
- Item 13.th It is my will and desire that all the property which I herein bequeath to my children which are under the age of twenty one years, together with all of my property not herein otherwise disposed of be kept in the premises together and managed under the direction of my executors hereinafter named for the benefit of my heirs untill my son Jesse W. Boykin arrives at the age of twenty one years, at which time he is to receive all the property herein bequeathed to him together with one horse, two cows and calves one sow & pig and one bed and furniture; and as my other younger children arrive at the age of twenty one years they are each to receive

Item 11.th I will and bequeath to my
Boykin my four negroes viz. Margaret, Phoebe, Susan & Abby -
Item 12.th It is my will and desire that all my land not
otherwise disposed of be kept together for the support of the
family untill my son Jesse W. Boykin comes to the age
of twenty one years, at which time the land is to be
equally divided into four parts, one of which parts I will
to my wife Elizabeth Boykin, another of which parts I
will to my son Jesse W. Boykin, another of which parts
I will to my son Sterling Boykin, and the other of which
parts I will to my son Francis A. Boykin each one
to receive their equal parts as they come of age, or call
for their parts, provided that if my wife Elizabeth Boykin
should again marry before my youngest son comes to the
age of twenty one years a division of the said land im-
mediately to take place under the direction of my executors
herein after named together with all other property, which
may be left subject to future distribution among my heirs

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It is my will and desire that all the property
which I herein bequeath to my children which are
under the age of twenty one years, together with all
of my property not herein otherwise disposed of be kept
in the premises together and managed under the direction
of my executors hereinafter named for the benefit of my
heirs untill my son Jesse W. Boykin arrives at the age
of twenty one years, at which time he is to receive
all the property herein bequeathed to him together
with one horse, two cows and calves one sow &
pigs and one bed and furniture, and as my other
younger children arrive at the age of twenty one
years they are each to receive their property
herein named together with one horse, two cows
and calves, one sow and pigs and one bed &
furniture and when the youngest of my children
arrives at the age of twenty one years

and receive his part as above mentioned, then a division
of the whole of my property which is not otherwise
disposed of be equally shared among all my children
Item 14th It is my will and desire that my faithful
friend William Williams together with my son
John J. Boykin, and my friend Wm. H. Pearson
act as my true and lawful executors to carry into
full and complete effect this my last will and
testament — In witness whereof I the said Francis
Boykin have hereunto set my hand and affixed my
seal this 8th day of July in the year of our
Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty two.
