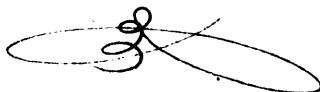

(William St. John W. Elizabeth Ann. And if there should be another child or  
children borned after my death all to be raised and Educated out of the proceeds  
of the above named property Except the Auditions above named. I give and bequeath  
with the above named property to my wife Ann Eliza Boswell during her  
natural life. Item 2<sup>nd</sup>. It is further my will and desire that my Executor sell a  
sufficient quantity of such property as he deems proper to satisfy all my present  
debts either at publick or private sale

Item 3<sup>rd</sup>. It is further my will and desire that the remaining part of my Estate be  
sold at any time if thought expedient by my executor or any part of it either  
publick or private sale and it is also my will and desire that the remaining part  
of my Estate above named should be equally divided between my three children

children should be borned after my death to draw a full share with my three
