In the name of God Amen I Henry Sedbetter of the State and County aforesaid, being weak in body but of sound mind and memory do make this my last will and testament in manner and form following that is to say.

1st I will that all my just debts be paid

2nd I will that my beloved wife have one half of my Estate to dispose as she thinks proper

3rd I leave the other half of my Estate to my wife during her natural life and at her decease the one half loaned to her to be equally divided between the heirs of my sisters body that is to say Abadiere Chambers; heirs I leave the whole control and management of my Estate with my Executors to sell or buy property as they may think best

4th I direct my Executors with power to prevent the mismanagement of the one half of my Estate which is willed to my sisters children and they shall have power in case my wife should marry and the property be likely to be diminished to take said property and appropriate it to the maintenance of my wife her life time and then divide it as before named

5th I will that William H. Pearson, Henry Sedbetter and John M. Pearson be my Executors to carry into effect this my last will and testament hereby revoking all other wills before made by me
