

My Will & Testament
In the name of God amen. I Henry Ware of the County
of Jasper & State of Georgia calling to mind that it is appointed
unto all men once to die, being in a low state of health
but of sound mind and memory do make this my last
will and testament.

Item 1st I recommend my spirit to God that give it & my
body to its mother earth in a Christian manner.

Item 2^d I will that all the property that I have should be
kept together on the plantation till my eldest child and
all my children come of age at which time I wish my
children as they come of age to receive as much of my
estate as my Executors shall think proper to pay them.

Item 3^d I will to my beloved wife one third part of my
estate during her natural life & at her death to return
to my children.

Item 4th It is my will that my Executors hereafter named
shall in all cases use their discretion in disposing of my
estate or any part thereof and in buying any property for
the benefit of the plantation or the family.

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Item 5th I appoint my wife, James Ware & Wilson Whalley
my Executors to execute this my last will & testament.
