First I give my soul to God that gave it and my body to be buried at the discretion of my Executors, and as to my Earthly estate, I will also dispose of as follows. — Item 1st I will that my just debts first be paid out of money arising from a sale that I wish made of the property that my wife can best span for that purpose — Item 2^d I lend unto my beloved wife Rebecca Williamson the balance of the property to maintain her lifetime. — Item 3^d I give my son, James, my son George and my daughter Sally a bed and furniture each, also a cow and calf, a sow and pigs in order to put them out on equal footing with the rest of the children. — Item 4th After the death of my wife I will that the balance or whole of the property be sold at public sale for twelve months credit, the money collected and equally divided after deducting one hundred and twenty seven dollars out of ~~Lucy~~ Burrys part and the part that I intended to give to my daughter Rebecca, I give and bequeath unto Susan Emeline and Phoebe W. Vopris daughters and lawful begotten heirs of the body of the above named Rebecca Harris after deducting eighty five dollars out of it. — Item 5th I will that fifteen dollars be deducted out of my daughter Suzannahs part of money. — Item 6th I nominate, ordain and appoint my trusty friends Hester Morgan & Nathan Collins the sole Executors of this my last will & testament, revoking all former wills and testaments made by me — In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 11th day of May 1892
