- not at the decision of my Executors and not doubting but it
be raised again at the Resurrection of the dead; and as to my
worldly goods which, when it has pleased God to bless me with
I dispose of in the following manner viz.

Item 1st I will and bequeath to my beloved wife Sarah Bullard
one negro man name Frank and Delphy, a Mary Lewis and
little Tom, two beds and as much furniture as she may need
and one pine slab, two trunks, one walnut table, and one
pine table one Red poplar table and one case of knives & forks
and as much crockery ware and kitchen furniture as she may
wish to keep and her choice of my stock of horses, two cows and
calves of her own choosing, two sows and shoats, twelve hundred
lbs of pork and as much corn fodder and wheat as will last
one year, five hundred and four hundred dollars in cash, with
liberty of buying her a piece of land if she may think proper
the above named property to remain in her possession during her
natural life, and then to be sold and four hundred dollars to
be paid to James and Wiley Bullard Orphans of Wiley Bullard
deceased and fifty dollars a piece to my grand children Able
Hammock, Solly Hammock and Francis English to be paid
out of the sale of the property after the death of my wife and
to Williams Bullards Orphans, Mary Knight, Sarah Wilson and
James Bullard fifty dollars each and to my Grandson Jesse
Bullard one hundred dollars, all to be paid out of the sale of
the property after the death of my wife

Item 2nd I will and bequeath to my daughter Solly Jackson

an negro girl named Frances, at her appraisement
Item 3rd I will and bequeath to my daughter Sarah Bro
one negro girl name Joan at her appraisement.

Item 4th I will and bequeith that all the balance of my
property that has not been named in my Will. be sold and
divided equally among my children taking into consideration
what some have already received; except one bed and furniture
that to be divided between John W. Bullard and Leon R. Bullard

Item 5th I constitute and appoint my trusty friends Thos
B Erwin, Albert Alexander and James G Bullard my true
and lawful Executors to this my last Will and testament
In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and aff
my seal this 29th day of July 1830.
