

In the name of God Amen I James Phillips of the State of Georgia and County of Jasper being weak in body but of sound mind and memory blessed be Almighty God for the same but knowing it is
1st for all mortal men once to die do make and publish this my last will and testament in manner and form following that is to say first
 It 1st will and desire is that my Esq^r hereinafter named apportion to my wife Phineas Phillips ten acres in the East corner of Lot # 108 1st
 Part of originally Baldwin and now Jasper County whereon I now live by permission of Nathan Phillips who is the rightful owner of the aforesaid Lot, or that said Nathan Phillips provide a comfortable home for her elsewhere, also I give my wife one negro woman by the name of Sela, ten barrels of corn three hundred pounds of bacon, one cow and calf one sow and pigs, and that my Esq^r purchase for her one horse to be worth thirty dollars out of the proceeds of my Estate all for her support during her life or widowhood and that after her death or intermarriage that all the aforesaid property revert back to my Estate and be disposed as hereinafter directed
 It 2^d I further give to my wife the i reserved one bed and furniture say two blankets, one sheet one counterpane one bed Quilt to be selected by her one bolster and two pillows, two dishes six plates, six cups and saucers, one dinner pot and one small pot, one small coffee pot one set of knives and forks, one water pail and one washing tub, one bridle saddle
 It 3^d I give to my son Lewis Phillips five Dollars
 4th It. I give to my son Wiley Phillips five Dollars.
 5th It. I give to my son Thomas G Phillips five dollars.
 6th It. I give to my two sons Nathan and Daniel Phillips the twenty two acres and one half of land known by the Cabins Land said Daniel Phillips twelve and one half acres and Nathan Phillips the remainder say ten acres, furthermore I give to Nathan Phillips all the mill Pond and Land out of Morrisses plat and Grant that has not been deeded away and for Nathan Phillips to pay Lewis Phillips, Daniel Phillips Wiley Phillips and Thomas G Phillips ten dollars each in two years after this will goes to record
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9th A. I give to my daughter Rhoda Hardy one negro woman by the name of Sarah and the note of hand I hold against John Hardy for one hundred thirty three Dollars fifty two and one half cents.

9th A. I give to my daughter Argew Sessions three hundred dollars or one negro man by the name of Summerset, but make it choice & right of Nathan Phillips, should he be so disposed to pay over the aforesaid sum of three hundred Dollars to my daughter above named and keep and convert to his use said negro man Summerset. also I give to my daughter Argew Sessions one sorrel mare by the name of lady lop.

11th A. I give to my grand son James Phillips one lot of land in the Eighth District of now Pike County and State aforesaid #10159.

11th A. My will and desire is that all my land and effects not herein disposed of be sold and the proceeds be equally divided by my executors to all my children above named. I hereby appoint Nathan Phillips and Wiley Phillips my sole Executors to this my last will and Testament hereby revoking all former wills by me made. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 25th day of February 1831. Signed, sealed, published and delivered by the above named Testator to be his last will and Testament in the presence of us who have hereunto subscribed our names as witnesses in the presence of the Testator.
