ORDER FOR HOMESTEAD.

To *Saurin & Cook*

County Surveyor of said County:

James H. Woodard

of said County, having applied to me for the benefit of an Act passed by the General Assembly of said State, entitled "An Act to provide for setting apart a Homestead of Realty and Personalty, and for the valuation of said property, and for the full and complete protection and security of the same to the sole use and benefit of families, as required by ~~Section~~ ^{Article} ~~First~~ of Article ~~Seven~~ of the Constitution of said State, and for other purposes," approved ~~October 31st, 1862~~, and other laws passed by said General Assembly to carry said Section and Article of the Constitution into effect:

You are Hereby Ordered to lay off, on or out of *the land of James H. Woodard, a Homestead of twice married persons, wife and son, James H. Woodard, John Woodard, Maria A. Woodard & others*

the Homestead allowed said *James H. Woodard* and family by said Article and Section of the Constitution of said State and said laws of said General Assembly, and make a plat thereof, and return the same to me, on or before the *third* day of *January* 1880, under oath, as prescribed by the Act first aforesaid.
