Jasper County 8th April 1812 J. E. Brewer of Jasper County, Georgia, calling to mind that when have once to die, do make constitute and appoint Mrs. Black and Rev. Richard Holmes to execute this my last will and testament, in manner following I give all my property consisting of my notes, land, stock of all kinds, household furniture and kitchen furniture with all the plantation tools, during her living single or in widowhood, if she should marry one half of all to be taken and divided between my friends, and my wife's friends, and at my wife's death, all my negroes to her place or a piece of land and to Holmes and Black shall act as their guardians, and see that they labor enough for their own support and let them enjoy their freedom in that way as our laws will not free them -

And I give to Agnes Black five hundred dollars, to be taken out of my estate, before the above distribution; which this being my last will and Testament and confirming the same and no other to be my deliberate wish & intention. Signed, sealed and delivered in presence of
